


LAKELAND FIRST FRIDAY

LAKELAND | Police Chief Lisa Womack resigned Friday, January 25, two days after a no-confidence vote by Lakeland Police Department employees.

In a message to City Manager Doug Thomas, the chief wrote she was quitting, effective May 1, because it was the best thing for her and her family.

Her resignation comes after a year in which the department faced the most widespread scandal in its history — a sweeping sexual-misconduct investigation — criminal cases fouled by search and reporting procedures, the arrest of an officer on charges he sexually abused and stalked a woman while on duty, and a grand jury investigation into problems with Womack and the department's handling of public records. In all, 27 LPD employees have been disciplined, including about a dozen officers who resigned in lieu of termination and three who were fired.

PRAISE AND CRITICISM

Thomas lauded Womack during Friday's news conference.

"Over the past year, Chief Womack has had to oversee numerous workplace misconduct investigations and criticisms of some departmental operations that in many cases predated her tenure," he said. "During that time she has professionally handled the criticisms and consistently implemented improvements for the betterment of the department."

Thomas spoke about her accomplishments at the department, including the development of a squad that deploys additional officers during certain hours; the complete rewrite of the department's general-order manual; overseeing an arrest of 47 people charged with the illegal purchase of firearms and drugs; and the attainment of re-accreditation by the Commission on Law Enforcement Accreditation and the Commission on Florida Accreditation, which had been lost under the previous chief.



Less than an hour before City Manager Doug Thomas announced her resignation, Chief Womack gave the closing remarks during a Lakeland Police Department graduation ceremony.
