LCPAAA Police Academy Scholarship Becomes A Reality!

After a year of planning and research, the LCPAAA has joined forces with the Polk State College Foundation to establish a Scholarship Fund for aspiring Lakeland Police Officers. "We will have to start small, funding only about 25% of the program's cost. We hope that if we continue to raise money each year to bolster the fund, one day it will cover all costs for a young man or woman to train for city law enforcement," said Steve Jones who was appointed by the Association's President, Stan Martin, to Chair the Scholarship

Committee. "We are very excited, said Jones. This, along with our longtime efforts to assist the Canine Division of the Department, will define our organization."

Lakeland Police Department's Community Services Unit Named *Crime Prevention Unit of the Year*

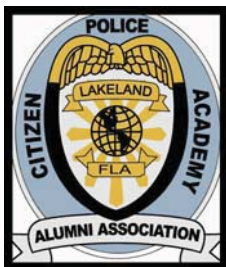
